

**AMENDMENT CONTRIBUTION AGREEMENT NUMBER 1
AGREEMENT ON THE PROVISION OF POLICING SERVICES
IN THE COMMUNITY OF LISTUGUJ
FROM APRIL 1, 2018 TO MARCH 31, 2019**

AMONG:

LISTUGUJ MI'GMAQ GOVERNMENT
represented by the Chief
(hereinafter referred to as the "Council")

AND:

HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN IN RIGHT OF CANADA
represented by the Minister of Public Safety and
Emergency Preparedness
(hereinafter referred to as "Canada")

AND:

THE GOVERNMENT OF QUEBEC
represented by the ministre de la Sécurité publique,
the ministre responsable des Relations canadiennes
et de la Francophonie canadienne and the ministre
responsable des Affaires autochtones
(hereinafter referred to as "Quebec")

(hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties")

WHEREAS the Parties entered into an Agreement on August 23rd, 2018, entitled Agreement on the provision of policing services in the community of Listuguj for the period from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019 (hereinafter called the "Original Agreement") under the First Nations Policing Program.

WHEREAS Canada shall provide its share of the funding contribution provided for in this Agreement, in accordance with the First Nations Policing Services Program (FNPP) and in accordance with its policies and procedures.

WHEREAS the Parties wish to amend the Original Agreement in conformity with paragraph 6.3.

WHEREAS this Amendment is to extend the term of the agreement by one year, to add funding for fiscal year 2019-2020 and to withdraw the upper threshold of \$100,000 for the purpose of the reallocation of funds.

CONSEQUENTLY, the parties agree as follows:

1. The Preamble and Schedule A form an integral part of this Amendment.
2. All terms and conditions of the Original Agreement remain unchanged except as provided in this Amendment.
3. Paragraph 1.4.4 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:
 - 1.4.4 The territory covered by this agreement is as follows:

The Listuguj territory means that part of the Listuguj Mi'gmaq territory which is known as Listuguj Indian Reserve No. 1 including the lands described in the Order in Council of the Privy Council of Canada (P.C. 2012-829) approved on June 19, 2012 attached as Schedule F. For greater certainty, it also includes Indian Lake Road, the section of Highway 132 between Riverside West and Dundee Road, the portion of Listuguj Indian Reserve No. 1 located at the entrance of the Inter-provincial Bridge and the portion of Listuguj Indian Reserve No. 1 covering a portion of the rue Principale from the entrance of the Inter-provincial bridge onto Caplan Road".

The Parties agree that if Canada, Quebec and the Council agree in writing to extend the territory, they shall discuss the amendments required to this Agreement to fund the policing services therein.

The territorial description applies strictly to this Agreement and is without prejudice to the respective positions of the Council, Canada and Quebec with regard to the community's territorial boundaries.

4. Paragraph 4.2.1 b) of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.2.1 b) In accordance with the budget in Schedule A of this Agreement, at:

\$1,597,914 for Fiscal Year 2018-2019;

\$1,641,857 for Fiscal Year 2019-2020;

totaling \$3,239,771 for the agreement as a whole.

5. Paragraph 4.2.2 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.2.2 The annual contributions of Canada and Quebec shall be established for each fiscal year in accordance with the following ratio: fifty-two per cent (52%) for Canada and forty-eight per cent (48%) for Quebec.

For each Fiscal Year, the respective contributions of Canada and Quebec are:

a) For Fiscal Year 2018-2019:

\$830,915 for Canada;

\$766,999 for Quebec.

b) For Fiscal Year 2019-2020:

\$853,766 for Canada;

\$788,091 for Quebec.

6. Paragraph 4.2.3 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.2.3 The Council shall respect the budget set out in Schedule A (Police Service Budget). However, it may reallocate funds between budget items, without authorization or preparing an amended budget, when the reallocation is less than twenty per cent (20%) of one of the amounts identified under one of the budget items in Schedule A.

7. Paragraph 4.2.4 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.2.4 If the reallocation is higher than amount indicated in 4.2.3, or if the budgetary reallocation requires the addition of a new eligible budget item or the removal of an existing budget item, the Council shall obtain the written authorization of Canada and Quebec.

8. Paragraph 4.3.2 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.3.2 The payment schedule for Canada is as follows:

For each fiscal year covered by this Agreement, Canada shall pay the Council its annual contribution based on the following terms:

fifty percent (50%) of its share, on May 1st and October 1st of each fiscal year covered by this Agreement.

9. Paragraph 4.3.3 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

4.3.3 The payment schedule for Quebec is as follows:

For each fiscal year covered by this Agreement, Quebec shall pay the Council its annual contribution based on the following terms:

fifty (50%) of its share, on June 1st and November 1st of each fiscal year covered by this Agreement.

10. Paragraph 6.10.1 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

6.10.1 This Agreement will come into effect on the date on which it is signed by all Parties and covers the period from April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2020 unless it is terminated in accordance with subsection 6.6.

11. Paragraph 6.10.2 of the Original Agreement is replaced by the following:

6.10.2 However, if the Parties expressly agree, in a written notice sent to the other Parties before March 31, 2020, to maintain the provisions of this Agreement, these provisions, except the sections regarding funding in Part IV, shall remain in force until a new agreement on the provision of policing services is entered into. Nonetheless, if such a new agreement is not entered into before March 31, 2021, the provisions of this Agreement will expire.

12. Schedule A (Police Service Budget) of the Original agreement is replaced with the attached Schedule A.

13. Schedule F (Maps of the territory) of the Original agreement is replaced with the attached Schedule F.
